## **LIVING FAITHFULLY, HUMAN SEXUALITY AND THE UNITED METHODIST CHURCH**

Tuesdays, 6:30 - 8pm, September 18 - October 9

Karolann and Rev. Richard Whetsell are facilitating an exploration of the UMC's sometimes contrasting views about God and sexuality. *Living Faithfully, Human Sexuality and the United Methodist Church* is a short book that represents every side of the issues. It outlines the history of our denomination's debate, the scriptures that inform it, and personal testimonies from differing points of view. A copy will be available for loan in the church library as well. Teens and adults are welcome to this four-week discussion and study group. Childcare can be arranged by request. ## **QUALIFIED CHARITABLE CONTRIBUTION BY SENIORS**

For those members who are 70 ½ and older, a smart way to make a donation to the church is by using the required minimum distribution from an IRA account. Although in the new Tax Cuts and Jobs Act starting this year, you will not be able to use the donation as a deduction, donating to the church will eliminate the federal income tax you normally would pay on the amount. It must be made with pre-tax money.

The amount of the required distribution is usually added to your gross income. By having a check drawn directly to the church from this amount, you are saving 3.8% surtax on the donation. The contribution must be made directly from the IRA custodian.

## RADICAL HOSPITALITY: WINTER SHELTER RETURNING TO SUMC




The Winter Shelter hopes to stay at Snoqualmie UMC, November 3rd through January. If all goes as anticipated with city permitting and our building use arrangements, we will host them for 90 days, i.e. through January. That's 30 days longer than previous years. The extended stay reduces stress for shelter guests, saves money by cutting moving expenses, and improves services due to our proximity to the Day Center housed in the American Legion Hall next door.
