WHAT ARE YOU DOING THIS SUMMER?

My 17-year-old daughter Daisy and I are heading to Guatemala in late June. We'll be gone nearly four weeks. There is much to learn alongside the people there - about them, about Guatemala, about God, about ourselves... I hope we'll stay open each day to Grace, sharing whatever we can give, receiving whatever we are given. I suppose that's life's best orientation no matter where we are in the universe.

Thank you for the flexibility that allows for this faith-filled adventure. We've signed up to volunteer several days in a neighborhood of Guatemala City called La Limonada, and then a week with San Lucas Mission in San Lucas. We'll spend a week in language school too, and visit with inspired leaders of another ministry called Opal House. We're practicing risk-taking mission and service, and with ample humility I'm sure. Daisy imagines joining the Peace Corps someday and this will be her first sampling of what that might be like. She's excited to get matching tattoos in Antigua before we head home. Please pray for us!

I know some people have Biblical reservations about tattoos. Indeed, Leviticus 19:28 directs us *not* to tattoo any marks upon ourselves. I wonder if that's because - in context - such marks identified peoples' allegiance to a different type of god. Biblically speaking, I sure appreciate *God's* tattoo: "I will not forget you," God assures his people. "I have inscribed you on the palms of my hands." (Isaiah 48:15-16)

Our congregation will continue to grow in love and service while I'm away June 24 - July 22. Rev. Melvin Woodworth, Marcia Bennett-Reinert, and Linda Boord will inspire from the pulpit. Our congregational care team will be praying and tending to pastoral needs as they come up. Our co-lay leaders Ron Sumners and Linda Boord will be on call. The Hero Central VBS team will gear up for fun... Songs will rise... All of our part-time ministries continue in the hands of a full-time God!

What are *you* doing this summer? I'll be praying for you too.

TRUSTEE NOTES

- Our church family should watch for notices this summer for a "cleaning and sorting" of storage areas around the church. The Trustees are planning to completely clean, sort and discard unneeded items especially in the 2 basement areas. Volunteers will be needed as well as input on what items should go and which can stay. Other storage areas will be sorted and organized as well upstairs, downstairs and around. Hope you can help when we need you.
- Watch for some major renovations to take place from June to fall. The Trustees are anticipating replacing the "push" door at the bottom of the ramp; re-roofing the flat education wing roof; and replacing the three furnaces that are over 15-20 years old and have served their lifetimes. Details will be given on dates, contractors and monetary sources. You will be glad to know that we do not expect to use pledge monies from our 2017 budget, or need a pledge drive as we have in the past for major projects.. The church does have a "capital budget" from the sale of a parsonage back in the 1970's. This money can only be used on projects that will last over 5 years. The Finance Committee and Church Council/Lead Team will have an opportunity to review and vote on these 3 upgrades. Trustees have been working on these projects for many months, and have been getting reputable bids and considering our financial picture. We have never tried to accomplish this many projects in a short time in the 53 years I have been here and have served four terms on the Trustees Committee. We are all glad that we will be able to accomplish all of this to keep our building in good shape for the many people and organizations that count on our facility.

The United Methodist Social Creed

- For Methodist founders John and Charles Wesley, personal piety and social action went hand in hand. Loving God and neighbor has a way of shaping our politics for the common good. What do you believe at the intersection of faith and society's struggles? Our original Social Creed came about in response to societal pressures in 1908. The current version below took shape in 1972. -

We believe in God, Creator of the world; and in Jesus Christ, the Redeemer of creation. We believe in the Holy Spirit, through whom we acknowledge God's gifts, and we repent of our sin in misusing these gifts to idolatrous ends.

We affirm the natural world as God's handiwork and dedicate ourselves to its preservation, enhancement, and faithful use by humankind.

We joyfully receive for ourselves and others the blessings of community, sexuality, marriage, and the family.

We commit ourselves to the rights of men, women, children, youth, young adults, the aging, and people with disabilities; to improvement of the quality of life; and to the rights and dignity of all persons.

We believe in the right and duty of persons to work for the glory of God and the good of themselves and others and in the protection of their welfare in so doing; in the rights to property as a trust from God, collective bargaining, and responsible consumption; and in the elimination of economic and social distress.

We dedicate ourselves to peace throughout the world, to the rule of justice and law among nations, and to individual freedom for all people of the world.

We believe in the present and final triumph of God's Word in human affairs and gladly accept our commission to manifest the life of the gospel in the world. Amen.

2 cups frozen strawberries

- 1 medium banana
- 1 cup low-fat strawberry yogurt or vanilla yogurt
- 1/2 cup cranberry juice cocktail or pomegranate juice
- 1 tablespoon pure maple syrup

Preparation

1. Place strawberries, banana, yogurt, juice and maple syrup in a blender and blend until smooth. Divide among six 4-ounce freezer-pop molds. Freeze until firm, at least 6 hours.
